

# **HOW TO MEASURE FOR CURTAINS:** A step-by-step guide

Choosing the right curtains starts with accurate measurements.

Whether you're dressing up a new room or replacing old curtains, this guide will walk you through everything you need to know to get the perfect fit.

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- A metal tape measure (cloth tapes can stretch and give inaccurate results).
- A notepad and pen, or your phone, to record the measurements.
- A step ladder, when measuring tall windows or recesses.
- Measure in cm to get a more accurate measurement.

# **MEASURE THE DROP (LENGTH)**

Decide how long you want your curtains to be.

**Common drop styles include:** 

# **Sill length**

Curtains finish 1cm above the windowsill.

#### **Below the sill**


Curtains fall 15–20cm below the sill.

#### **Floor length**

Curtains stop about 1cm above the floor.

#### **Puddled**

Curtains slightly pool on the floor – add 5–10cm.



# **MEASURING FROM A POLE:**

#### Eyelet curtains

Measure from the top of the pole. Allow 3cm above the pole for top of curtain.

## • Pencil, Pinch or Wave top

Measure from the bottom of the curtain ring where the curtain will hang from.

#### **MEASURING FROM A TRACK:**

Measure from the top of the track to where you want the curtain to finish.

## MEASURE THE WIDTH

## If you have a curtain pole:

Measure the full width of the pole, not the window. Exclude any decorative finials (end caps).

# If you have a track:

Measure the entire length of the track. If it overlaps in the centre (common with curtain tracks), include the overlap in your measurement.

# FINAL CHECKS BEFORE ORDERING

- Record measurements in centimetres (cm).
- Write down width first, then drop (e.g. W120cm x D150cm).
- Always measure twice for accuracy.
- Consider lining options, including; thermal, blackout, etc.
